Annie Sherwood Hawks was a housewife who was going through particular trials and difficulties. And these things can bring out anger, fear, worry, and depression. Have you experienced that?

As she was experiencing these things, she stopped and thought how a person could live their life without God in their lives. And she realized that she needed to rely on Him just as much every day as what she did at the moment of her salvation. She said that only when we are close to Him in the trials will be there peace. She said that these thoughts took full possession of her as she sat for her morning devotions. So, she went near an open window in June, and took up her pencil and began writing all five verses in order of the hymn that we sing. The words were healing for her as her trial subsided.

Annie's pastor, Robert Lowry, set the words to music, and had it sung at a Sunday School Convention held in Cincinnati, Ohio!

But the words were prophetic for her as well. It was many long years afterward when a shadow of a great loss fell over her that she understood the comforting words again. The hymn? "I Need Thee Every Hour."
